Element 1 - Match the Individual to the Job

Exhibit 1.3NL - Distinguish Between Abilities and Skills

A skill is something that can be taught, like typing.

An ability is something inherent to a person, like being able to tolerate high repetition while maintaining detailed focus. Abilities can rarely be taught.

Having the needed abilities are usually the critical factors for success in a job.

However, job descriptions almost always list only skills. We encourage employers to also list the needed abilities.

Thus, in matching an individual to a job one should look at the matching of the individual's abilities to the abilities required by a job.
