There must be funds for financing fund-raising and management of the Uniquely Abled Academy, e.g., administrative support, etc., beyond scholarships.

The mission is grand but requires a willingness of others to help make it a reality.

## How to Find Funding for Your UAA

- Assemble a small group of committed volunteers. Ask them for recommendations. Connect via LinkedIn so you can see their personal networks. Don't be afraid to ask for introductions to potential funders: philanthropists, major company executives, etc.
- 2. Go to your local library with free access to Candid.org's fundraising database (find it at <u>www.candid.org</u>)
  - Once there, you can search your local community's philanthropic foundations. Look up terms like "workforce development," "special needs," and "financial independence" to cast a wide net for potential funders.
  - b. Look at funders of organizations in your area that do similar work. Those are often good prospects for funding your work.
  - c. Once you have a large list of potential funders, you'll need to check their website to understand their funding priorities, their deadlines, etc. Some do not accept unsolicited grant inquiries.
  - d. If possible, reach out to potential with a one-pager about the UAA to have an introductory conversation. In this conversation, you'll be able to learn if this is a good fit and spend your time accordingly.
- 3. Share your one-pager with potential partners who could help make your UAA stronger: your local MEP Center, university, community college, nonprofits, etc.
- 4. Sign up for grants.gov. When you join their email list, you can select the appropriate departments to follow.
